**THE EMPEROR PENGUIN.** 1. Penguins are flightless birds. 2. While other birds have wings for flying, penguins have adapted flippers to help them swim in the water. 3. The emperor penguin is the largest of 17 species of penguin at 1.15 m tall. 4. It's only animal to live in Antarctica during winter. 5. Penguins have lots of feathers and lots of fat in their bodies so they can survive in very cold weather as cold as -80 degree Celsius. 6. They can dive deeper than any other bird as deep as 565 m and they can stay under water for more than 20 minutes. 7. If you would like to help them you can reduce carbon emissions which lead to global warming.

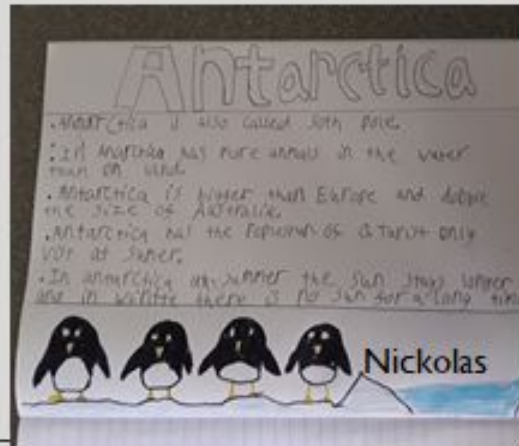
What effect does Global warming have on the animals around the ice caps? Animals living on the ice cap will not have any ground to stand on because it will be too hot under the ice cap to live.

Antarctica is the southernmost continent on Earth. The South Pole is found in Antarctica. Antarctica is surrounded by the Southern Ocean. Antarctica is bigger than Europe and almost double the size of Australia. Most of Antarctica is covered in ice over 1.5 kilometres thick. Because it experiences such little rain, Antarctica is considered a desert. The coldest recorded temperature on Earth occurred in 1983 at Vostok Station, Antarctica, measuring a rather chilly -89.2 °C. While humans don't permanently reside in Antarctica, several thousand people live and work at various research facilities found on the continent. While Antarctica features harsh living conditions, a number of plants and animals have adapted to survive and call the icy continent home.
