

St Peter's School Vision and Values

The school values underpin all that we do at St Peter's School. Having an effective School Travel Plan demonstrates our commitment to being **responsible** citizens and providing equal, fair and **respectful** opportunities for safe travel to and from the school.

About our school

St Peter's R.C. Primary School is a Roman Catholic (RC) primary school situated in the Old Aberdeen area of Aberdeen. St Peter's serves the North RC zone of the city (which includes parts of Aberdeenshire) and has a number of pupils transported to school due to living more than 2 miles from the school but in zone.

Our school is part of the St Machar Academy Associated Schools Group (ASG). The school roll is currently 196 pupils.

We are currently situated on Dill Road in the Tillydrone area. This is due to our school building in Old Aberdeen currently being refurbished, with an estimated completion





timeline of October 2027. The main way for pedestrians (and cars) to access our school is via Dill Road.

We have a cycle / scooter rack located near the entrance to our current school building.

The school's catchment area can be seen in the map below:



Every year, we support pupils in P6 and P7 to complete Bikeability Levels 1 and 2. We are supported by Walk Wheel Cycle Trust and Adventure Aberdeen. Our Family Learning team also support with learn to ride sessions in the local community for younger pupils.

In school, we have an active "Junior Road Safety Officers" group, who promote safe travel across the school, including with our parents and wider community.





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
Rationale

What is a travel plan?

A travel plan is a document which encourages people to travel to our school in an eco-friendly, healthy and safe way. The travel plan supports walking and cycling as the most eco-friendly, active and safe way to travel to our school.

There are many benefits of walking and cycling to school:

- **Safety:** More people cycling and walking to school means less cars on the road and around the school gate making it a much safer environment for everyone.
- **Eco-Friendly:** By walking or cycling to school we are helping the environment and improving air quality around our school.
- **Health:** If you walk or cycle to school it is a good way to get exercise which offers mental and physical health benefits for the whole family.
- **Education:** Improving road safety awareness and knowledge of pupils, families and the wider community.

We want to create safer journeys for people travelling to and from St Peter's R.C. Primary School.

Context to our local area

St Peter's School is situated on Dill Road in Tillydrone.

Access to the school, for vehicles, is via two car parks located in front of the school building (directly off of Dill Road). Parking is available to staff and visitors to the school but is closed to parents.

Pupils access the school through a pedestrian pathway between the two car parks, which is accessed from Dill Road.


Taxis / minibuses for transported pupils arrive into the first car park off of Dill Road. Pupils who are transported by bus (school transport) are dropped off at a bus stop on Hayton Road and are walked round to the school / back to the bus stop by our transport escort.

Each morning, the gates into the school playground are opened at 8.50am and school staff are present in the playground and at the entrance to the school to welcome learners into the school grounds. Parents/carers can come with their child into the playground each morning and also collect pupils from the playground at the rear of the school at the end of the school day.

The school office entrance is accessed by coming through pedestrian walkway.



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There is a 20-mph speed limit along Dill Road at all times. There are “school – keep clear” zig-zag lines near to the school entrance.

Pupils are encouraged to walk, scoot, cycle, park and ride to school throughout the year. There are limitations to this due to some pupils being transported by the local authority.

There is currently no crossing patrol person nearby. There is a zebra crossing on Hayton Road near to the turn-off into Dill Road, and another zebra crossing beside the community centre on Hayton Road.

Our Travel Data



Our Junior Road Safety Officers regularly engage our school community in discussions about travelling to school. They organise competitions and promote road safety and active travel throughout the school year.

In addition, St Peter's School takes part in the Hands Up Scotland Survey on a yearly basis.

We are aware that at pick up and drop off times there have been a lot of school community concerns over drivers on Dill Road and those dropping off pupils.



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


Travel Data

Pupils travelling to school

The last "Hands Up Survey" (September 2025) found that 189 pupils surveyed reported normally travelling to school in the following ways:



Staff travelling to school

In February 2026, our Junior Road Safety Officers surveyed staff on their usual mode of transport to work. The following results were found from the 23 staff surveyed:

Current Travel Opportunities and Challenges:

The following have been identified as travel opportunities / benefits at our current site:

- There is more room for cars to park in the local area close to our Dill Road site.
- There is a bike rack to allow pupils and staff to securely padlock bikes / scooters outside the school.
- There are zebra crossings nearby to support safe walking to school.
- There are bus stops close by the school, supporting those travelling by public transport.
- Park and walk locations nearby include some on-street parking on Hayton Road, a public parking area near to Morrisons Daily and Seaton Park Car Park (South Entrance – St Machar Drive side).

The following have been identified as concerns / barriers to safe and active travel to St Peter's School (Dill Road):

- Drivers (parents / carers) not adhering to school policy and causing congestion around the school grounds by parking in the school car parks.
- Parents / carers parking on the road adjacent to the school and causing traffic flow problems for local residents, including when parking illegally or dangerously.
- Parents / carers parking across driveways.
- Cars parked on double yellow lines, zigzag lines or on the kerb / walkway.
- Cars stopping in the middle of the road to let pupils out / pick pupils up.
- Drivers not obeying the 20 mph speed limit on Dill Road.
- Pedestrians walking onto the road without looking to check if it is safe on Dill Road.
- Cars leaving doors open, causing traffic congestion.
- Very busy traffic at drop off and pick up times on Dill Road, which is a relatively small road.
- Lack of opportunities for pupils to travel actively to school, including because of distance from the school.

Aim: To create safer journeys for people travelling to and from St Peter's R.C. Primary School (Dill Road).

<p data-bbox="108 600 512 633">Junior Road Safety Officers (JRSOs)</p> 	<p data-bbox="619 600 1509 696">We have a group of pupil leaders called the Junior Road Safety Officers (JRSOs). This group consists of Primary 6 and Primary 7 pupils. Pupils in P6 apply to be JRSOs for a two-year period. The P7s lead the JRSOs.</p> <p data-bbox="619 725 1485 822">The group are led by Mrs Kelman, who supports them in creating an action plan each year to organise and promote road safety initiatives throughout the year.</p> <p data-bbox="619 851 868 884">Their actions include:</p> <ul data-bbox="667 887 1501 1339" style="list-style-type: none"> • Maintaining a display board in school • Holding short assemblies • Working with classes to lead road safety learning activities • Recruiting and training new JRSOs • Ordering and sharing road safety resources and materials throughout the school • Sharing their work through the school website and newsletters • Creating competitions to promote a culture of road safety • Running a "Beep Beep Day" for all classes, Active Adventure Day activities and a road safety themed transition day for new P1 pupils • Creating awareness campaigns, including videos for our newsletters and leaflets / tickets to remind drivers of our road safety expectations in school • Collecting travel data across the school
<p data-bbox="108 1361 536 1395">Hands Up Scotland Survey (Sustrans)</p> 	<p data-bbox="619 1361 1477 1518">Every year in the first term of school, we take part in the Hands Up Survey. JRSOs (supported by class teachers) collect information from every learner in the school on how they travel to school. This information is then sent to the Hands Up Survey organisers and is collated with statistics from Aberdeen City Council and National statistics from the whole of Scotland.</p>
<p data-bbox="108 1581 331 1615">Cycle / scooter rack</p> 	<p data-bbox="619 1581 1485 1648">We currently have a rack for children to put their bikes and scooters during school hours.</p>

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<p>Beep Beep Day</p> 	<p>We use the annual "Beep Beep Day" to support education around road safety in school.</p>
<p>Class learning</p> 	<p>All classes learn road safety when focusing on "safe" as part of our health and wellbeing curriculum linked to the wellbeing indicators. We use "Healthy Schools Scotland" website to support planning, learning and teaching here.</p>
<p>Road Safety Magic Show</p> 	<p>We take part in Magic Allan's Magic Road Safety Show where important messages about road safety are shared in a fun and exciting way. All classes benefit from this experience.</p>
<p>Links to our eco group work</p> 	<p>As part of our eco schools green flag work, our eco schools pupil voice group work with our JRSOs to promote walking and cycling to school.</p>
<p>Monthly school newsletters</p> 	<p>Traffic matters and JRSO updates are a regular feature in our monthly school newsletter (Sway).</p>
<p>Parent council</p> 	<p>Our parent council is a forum for parents to share any concerns around traffic matters. This is often an agenda item for our parent council matters.</p>

Tips to keep you safe when walking to school:

- Plan your route to school first. Discuss this with an adult. Find where there are crossings. Make use of these and plan a safe route you know.
- Find a good place to cross, this should be away from parked cars and have good visibility in both directions. Try to prevent crossing near parked cars or busy / main roads.
- Be bright and be seen. The more you stand out, the more drivers will see you and slow down.
- Be aware of driveways and narrow entrances.
- Stay alert and pay attention at all times.
- Use the pedestrian pathway to enter and leave the school grounds. Do not come through the car parks unless coming from a school transport taxi.



Tips to keep you safe when cycling or scooting to school:

Where pupils can do so safely, we actively encourage pupils to bike or scoot to school. Please feel free to bring your bike or scooter and make use of our bike and scooter shelters.

The school cannot take any responsibility for any bikes or scooters left here. You will need to bring a lock to secure your bike / scooter.

- Plan your route to and from school with an adult first.
- Wear a helmet and wear something bright.
- Ride in a position you can see and be seen.
- No cycling or scooting in the playground (unless part of a lesson).
- Consider other pedestrians. Use your bell if necessary to warn others that you are there.
- Maintain your bike. Check brakes and tyre pressure. Guides can be found online from Cycling Scotland.
- Use the clearly marked school entrances to come into the playground. Push your bike or scooter along with you when you enter the school grounds.
- Consider pedestrians at all times.





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Tips to keep you safe when driving to school:

- Plan ahead and give yourself plenty of time in order to account for any unexpected delays.
- Give yourself time to find a responsible place to park.
- Park and stride - parking 5 to 10 minutes from the school will help in tackling congestion.
- Keep your speeds low (well below the 20 mph limit on Dill Road).
- Always let your child out of the car on the pavement side.
- Do not park on yellow lines or other parking restrictions, or in front of driveways. Do not park in places where you will cause danger or obstruction.
- Check for other road users before you or your child open the car door.
- Set a good example by teaching your child about road safety.
- Do not use the school car parks to drop off or collect pupils.
- Use the clearly marked paths for children to walk safely into the school grounds.
